Grammar and punctuation

What errors should you look for?

Grammar	Articles, prepositions, subject-verb agreement, tense, verb forms
Punctuation	Use of common punctuation marks to improve coherence and unity (eg, commas, semicolons, colons)

Key to symbols used in this presentation:

Grammar errors:

subject-verb agreement/determiner-noun agreement/general statements

no subject-verb agreement

 The greatest *<u>loss</u> of lives following the disaster *<u>have</u> (<u>has</u>) occurred through lava flows and tsunamis.

no determiner-noun agreement

• *<u>This</u> *<u>two</u> (**These two**) graphs show similar trends. <u>Each</u> *<u>variables</u> (Each <u>variable</u>) is plotted.

incorrect use of singular noun in general statements

*<u>University</u> (Universities) all over the world have support *<u>service</u> (services) for international *<u>student</u> (students).

Grammar errors: tenses

inconsistent tense use

The government *<u>introduced</u> the new laws two years ago. The aim *<u>is</u>
 (was) to reduce accident rates.

wrong tense used

The price of oil *rose (has risen) by 3% in the last three months.

Grammar errors: verbs

missing verb to be (is/are/has/have)

Human activities <u>harming</u> (are harming) the environment.

incorrect use of active and passive

- The image *<u>was connoted</u> (connoted active voice) a sense of tranquility.
- The robots *programmed (are programmed passive voice) to perform a range of tasks without human intervention.

incorrect verb forms (especially past participles)

- The city *<u>was destroy</u> (was **destroyed**) by the cyclone.
- The criminals *can be make (can be made) to work in the mines.

Grammar errors: verb complements

V+ing /to+V confusion

- * <u>To study</u> hard is the key to success.
- **✓ Studying** hard is the key to success.
- * <u>Doing</u> well, it is important to have good time management skills.
- ✓ To do well, it is important to have good time management skills.
- * The engineers designed a new model *use the new specifications.
- ✓ The engineers designed a new model using the new specifications.

OR

✓ The engineers designed a new model which uses the new specifications.

Grammar errors: articles

missing article (a/ an/the)

- * ^Teacher asks ^students to read ^chapter on time management.
- * ^ New Zealand government is planning to introduce ^new and fairer tax system next year.
- ✓ The teacher asks the students to read the chapter time management.
- ✓ The New Zealand government is planning to introduce a new and fairer tax system next year.

wrong article

- * This is a important issue.
- ✓ This is an important issue. (noun after article begins with a vowel sound).

article used when not needed (for abstract ideas)

- * The time management is important.
- ✓ Time management is important.

Grammar errors: prepositions

missing preposition

The majority ^ people are against the proposal.

The majority of people are against the proposal.

wrong preposition

We are concerned *of the problem.

We are concerned **about** the problem.

incorrect preposition after a noun/verb/adjective

The impact *to the environment is considerable.

These practices relate *with the scientific management theory.

The gangsters are capable *for causing damage to the neighbourhood.

The impact **on** the environment is considerable.

These practices relate **to** the scientific management theory.

The gangsters are capable of causing damage to the neighbourhood.

Punctuation errors

no commas after a long clause or phrase/transition

In the middle of the first semester students are required to give presentations. However * many fail to fulfill the requirement.

- ✓ In the middle of the first semester, students are required to give presentations. However, many fail to fulfill the requirement.
- *According to a survey conducted by New Zealand's Department of Conservation in 2007 * carbon emissions have risen by 35% in five years. In fact * this is much higher than predicted.
- ✓ According to a survey conducted by New Zealand's Department of Conservation in 2007, carbon emissions have risen by 35% in five years. In fact, this is much higher than predicted.

Semi-colons (;) and colons (:) are also problematic.
