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How can you get good at grammar?


A good grammar learner:

1. Looks for PATTERNS in language

2. Works out what these PATTERNS do







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• You need to know where you're going wrong.





the correct information about the grammar feature.

- You need to understand clearly how the feature works.
- You may then understand why you make the error.





• You need to **practise** using the correct information.



Strategise

- You need to **keep** using the information in different contexts until you can use it correctly 'without thinking'.
- Track your progress in grammatical accuracy. (See a writing improvement chart in the next frame)
