Part 2: (5 - 6 minutes) Role play (Pilot - ATC)

Now, in this part, we're going to do some role plays. You will take the role of the pilot and I will take the role of the air traffic controller. You need to readback (repeat) the instructions I give you. You may want a pencil and paper to write down what you hear. I will send the role plays now.

[pause]

Have you received the role play instructions? Do you have a pencil and paper?

[wait for confirmation]

To check understanding of the role play:

Tell me, what is your call sign? [student answers - Six niner Bravo Lima]

Yes. Tell me, what is the air traffic control tower called? [student answers - Sydney Tower]

Yes. Tell me, how many situations are there? [student answers - 5]. Yes. Look at the first situation. "Situation 1: You have requested departure information. Readback (repeat) the ATC information that is needed. The ATC will speak first."

What do you need to do for this role play? [student answers - readback the instructions].

Yes. Let's now read over the other situations. [Examiner to read aloud the 4 other situations].

Alright, tell me, if you do not understand or hear something, what can you say? [student answers "Say Again"].

Do you understand what you need to do? [student answers]

OK. Let's begin.

Role play instructions and situations to be sent to test taker

Your aircraft callsign: 69BL

Air traffic controller (ATC): Sydney Tower

Situation 1: You have requested departure information. Readback (repeat) the ATC information that is needed. The ATC will speak first.

Situation 2: You are ready to taxi to the runway. Readback (repeat) the ATC clearance you receive. The ATC will speak first.

Situation 3: You are ready to line up on the runway. Readback (repeat) the ATC clearance you receive. The ATC will speak first.

Situation 4: You are ready to take off. Readback (repeat) the ATC clearance you receive. The ATC will speak first.

Situation 5: You are in the training area and have asked ATC to enter the circuit. Readback (repeat) the ATC clearance you receive. The ATC will speak first.

Remember, if you do not understand or hear something. You can ask the ATC to "Say again".
